The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Requirements

Our School Achievement Data

The 2019 FCAT Science Assessment results indicate a increase of 9 percentage points from 64% in 2018 to 73% in 2019. For grades 3 to 5 Learning Gains for FSA Math remain the same at 77% when comparing the data results from 2018 to 2019. The FSA ELA proficiency results indicated a 1 percentage point decrease from 81% to 80% in 2019. The 2019 SAT-10 for Reading indicates that the percentage of students reading above the median increased by 6% from 80% in 2018- 86% in 2019. The 2019 FSA in Mathematics remained the same at 81%.

- Throughout the school year, based on I-Ready diagnostic assessments, District level assessments, and teacher assessments, students are monitored for growth in each specific area.
- Intervention groups are based on this fluid data.

School-Parent Compact
